- The <u>Charlotte County Community Foundation</u> has activated the Charlotte County Disaster Relief Fund, which will provide financial assistance and resources to Charlotte County residents.
- The <u>Collier Community Foundation</u> has reactivated the Collier Comes Together Hurricane Fund to benefit nonprofit relief efforts and programs in southwestern Florida.
- The <u>Southwest Florida Community Foundation (Collaboratory)</u> has partnered with United Way and activated its SWFL Emergency Relief Fund.
